FGUA Urges Customers to Continue Observing Emergency Irrigation Guidelines

(Holiday, New Port Richey and Trinity, FL) The Florida Governmental Utility Authority (FGUA) officials urge all customers in its Aloha Gardens and Seven Springs service area to continue conserving water under existing water restriction guidelines.

A directive of the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) on September 29 maintains Phase III Water Restrictions for Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas Counties. The Phase III Water Restrictions state:

- All customers in Pasco County must continue to be restricted to watering one day per week.
- The watering days remain the same as those previously established by SWFWMD. Properties using an in-ground irrigation system are only permitted to water before 8 a.m. or after 6 p.m.
- New lawns have a 30-day establishment period, permitting watering each day for 15 days, and then permitting watering every other day for the following 15 days.
- New plants have a 60-day establishment period, permitting watering each day for 30 days, and then permitting watering every other day for the following 30 days.
- Pressure washing is permitted for cleaning prior to painting, sealing, maintaining a material warranty, for health and safety standards as well as for abiding by local, state, or federal health laws.
- Residential car washing is permitted once per week and aesthetic fountains and water features are permitted to operate eight hours a day.

The FGUA continues to urge its customers to follow the guidelines in order to protect the water supply. Customers should also check with local authorities to see if stricter local guidelines are in place.
